About the African Sisters

The African Sisters do amazing work transforming the lives of mothers and vulnerable children in the communities where they live. They have 11 houses in Tanzania and one in Zambia. They belong to the Anglican Community of St Mary.



The Sisters are self-supporting mainly through farming but that depends on rainfall, which is increasingly unreliable. They plant trees which can be harvested for timber in less than ten years and help the environment by conserving water and growing green leaf crops.

What the Sisters do

Education

- Run nursery and primary classes for orphaned and other vulnerable children
- Provide primary school fees, books and uniform for children whose families cannot afford them
- Manage a hostel for secondary school girls so they can have safe board and lodging
- Receive training to become teachers, nurses and midwives

Health

- Give guidance in prevention of HIV/AIDS to young women in villages
- Work in local clinics and hospitals
- Train young mothers in hygiene and baby care
